



Airdrie to

This 14 mile cycleway and footpath forms part of the Clyde to Forth National Cycle Route. It follows the line of the old Airdrie to Bathgate Junction Railway (opened in 1862 and closed to passengers in 1956 and to freight in the late 1980s). The route starts at Drumgelloch Railway Station. Airdrie and ends near Bathgate Railway Station. It takes you along the shore of the Hillend Loch and offers fine views over the central plateau of Scotland, passing through Plains, Caldercruix and Blackridge.

Sculptures along the route reflect the rich industrial and relilway heritage of the area. The railway line is scheduled to be re-opened in 2007 and the cycle route will remain with some alteration to serve the new stations. The route is traffic-free, except for a short section through Caldercruix. There is wheelchair access to the whole route.

Sustrans - the sustainable transport charity - works on practical projects to encourage people to walk, cycle and use public transport in order to reduce motor traffic and its adverse effects. 5,000 miles of our flagship project, the National Cycle Network, were officially opened in June 2000, we will increase this to 10,000 miles by 2005.

The National Cycle Network is a comprehensive network of safe and attractive routes to cycle throughout the UK. 10,000 miles are due for completion by 2005, one third of which will be on traffic-free paths, the rest will follow quiet lanes or traffic-calmed roads. It is delivered through the policies and programmes of over 450 local authorities and other partners, and is co-ordinated by the charity Sustrans.
